Memantine (Namenda)

How to take your Namenda tablets

Why do I need this medicine?

Radiation treatments to the brain can affect your memory. Your doctor has prescribed memantine to help reduce this side effect of radiation therapy.

How do I take it?

Memantine tablets come in 2 doses: 5 mg and 10 mg. Week by week, here are your doses to take:

Week 1:	

• Morning: One 5 mg tablet

Week 2: _____

- Morning: One 5 mg tablet
- Evening: One 5 mg tablet
 (A total of 10 mg a day)

Week 3: _____

- Morning: Two 5 mg tablets
- Evening: One 5 mg tablet (A total of 15 mg a day)



Take your memantine tablets exactly as prescribed.

- Evening: One 10 mg tablet (A total of 20 mg a day)
