Preventing Infection After Breast Implant or Expander

Precautions to take

This handout explains important precautions to take after your surgery and what procedures to avoid. It is important to follow these guidelines to help prevent infection.

Special Precautions for the First 3 Months

For 3 months after your implant or expander surgery, do not have:

- Dental cleanings or other dental work that are elective (optional) and not urgent
- Procedures that involve your breathing system (respiratory tract) including:
 - Bronchoscopy with a rigid bronchoscope
- Procedures that involve your stomach or intestines (gastrointestinal tract) including:
 - Sclerotherapy for esophageal varices
 - Esophageal stricture dilation
 - ERCP (endoscopic retrograde cholangiography) with biliary obstruction
 - Colonoscopy or sigmoidoscopy
- Procedures that involve your genitals or urinary system, including:
 - Urethral dilation

If you do not know what something on this list means, show this page to your provider **before** you schedule anything.

Exceptions

If you need one of these procedures for an urgent problem, you **must** take antibiotics before the procedure. Your primary care doctor, our clinic, or the specialist doing your procedure can give you a prescription for antibiotics.

Which antibiotic should I take?

When you schedule a procedure, call our clinic at 206.598.1217 option 2, or send a MyChart message. Ask us to send a prescription for antibiotics to your pharmacy.

- If you are NOT allergic to penicillin: Take 2 grams of amoxicillin or cephalexin by mouth 1 hour before your procedure.
- If you ARE allergic to penicillin: Take 500 mg of azithromycin or 600 mg of clindamycin by mouth 1 hour before your procedure.

If Your Provider Has Questions

Procedures After 3 Months

If your implant or expander surgery was between 3 and 12 months ago, you will need to take antibiotics before having a procedure. Please call our clinic if you have any questions.
